## **PROGRAM**

State and National Elected Official 2020 Update US Rep. Dan Newhouse; Richard Evans (for US Sen. Maria Cantwell's office); Rep. Bruce Chandler (15<sup>th</sup> District); Rep. Tom Dent (13<sup>th</sup> District); Rep. Gina Mosbrucker (14<sup>th</sup> District); Sen. Judy Warnick (13<sup>th</sup> District), spoke on what they considered to be the highlights of the 2020 legislative sessions.

The 2021 Budget was a focal point for all speakers, along with the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Budget and our nation/state's economies. It was agreed that the longer it takes us to get back to normal, the longer it is going to take for our economy to recover, and that some businesses probably will be unable to recover at all. Long-term impacts on local and US economy. Receiving Whitehouse briefings each week.

Another concern addressed was the need for support for families who have still to receive any kind of unemployment benefits. All of the legislators are concerned with this and are doing all that they can to assist these families when they are made aware of the need. Most cases are easily solved.

The second Coronavirus relief package negotiations are at a stalemate.

All expressed the desire to get back into session in order to balance the budget and prevent a possible government shutdown. Currently a \$9 billion deficit.

Another topic touched on by many of the legislators are the devastating forest fires happening along the west coast and other areas of the country. Forest management practices are a focus for several of our legislators – excessive fuel equals catastrophic fires. Also emphasized the need for relief packages to those affected by the fires., Representative Mosbrucker complimented Representative Chris Corry on the PTSD bill for first responders. First responders need to be eligible for Workers Comp.

Mental health demands on the system are up by 30% due to COVID, fires, etc.

Representative Mosbrucker asked people to check Representative Newhouse's website – a lot of funding available. She also reminded everyone to encourage their constituents to complete the 2020 Census ... population translates into funding.

Broadband availability is a concern right now, with so many people working remotely and now with school starting up. Working to make sure all students have computers and access to internet.

Looking at ways to continue funding for small airports.

Senator Judy Warnick and Representative Gina Mosbrucker also spoke about Savanna's Act (improving information sharing, among law enforcement, regarding murdered Native American women) and also the need to end human trafficking of children.
