- Congratulations also to Yakima County who has been awarded over \$3,000,000 in Federal Bridge funding for repairs on the North Fork bridges, and \$1,385,600 for repairs to the South Naches Road bridge!!

$2021\text{-}2025\ Coordinated\ Public\ Transit - \underline{Human\ Services\ Transportation\ Planning}\ Award$

• YVCOG has received our 2021-2025 Coordinated Public Transit – Human Services Transportation Planning award letter from WSDOT, in the amount of \$40,000. This will help cover the cost of our HSTP plan, which was last updated in March 2019. This plan lays out needs throughout the valley that agencies and jurisdictions can then apply for public transportation consolidated grant funds. We will be doing a Call for Projects next summer. Will also use that information in support of the Transit Feasibility Study.

2022-2025 M-RTIP Development

- We are well into the process of updating our M/RTIP. This document consolidates all of the TIPs turned in by our individual jurisdictions – this report goes to the state and the feds, specifically to document secure federally-funded and regionally-significant projects over the next 4 years.
- We have received updates from almost all of the jurisdictions that we expected. Yakima County is not yet included in this list and is not required to turn theirs in until November.
- Public comment will begin September 14th.
- Will be presented to Policy Board for approval and adoption in mid-October, and then we enter the period where jurisdictions can make corrections and updates to their projects if they received delayed funding.
- Approximately 50 projects this year a few more than usual.

<u>AUGUST 2021 M/RTIP</u> <u>AMENDMENT</u>

- There are 6 amendments for August (and 1 administrative amendment)
 - Toppenish Jackson Street Extension \$1,750,416
 - Union Gap Main Street Pedestrian Crossing Improvements \$393,009
 - Union Gap Valley Mall Blvd. (S. 10th Ave to W. Washington Ave. \$1,233,000
 - Yakima North 1st Street Revitalization (MLK Blvd. to "J" Street \$11,080,000
 - Yakima Summitview Ave. Resurfacing (N. 40th Ave to N. 72nd Ave. excluding 48th to 56th) \$2,315,440
 - Yakima Transit Fixed Route Bus Improvement \$268,242
- Public Comment period ended August 11, 2021.
- On August 12, the TAC recommended forwarding to the Policy Board for adoption.

Decision: John Hodkinson moved to authorize the Chair to sign <u>Resolution</u> 2021-14 for Findings, <u>Resolution 2021-13 for Air Quality</u>, and the <u>August 2021 TIP Amendment Checklist</u>. Janice Gonzales seconded. The motion carried.

YAKAMA NATION (YN) HERITAGE CONNECTIVITY TRAIL CONCEPT PLAN

- The Concept Plan was adopted by Tribal Council on July 8th;
- The goal is to decrease bicycle and pedestrian fatalities and injuries
 within the boundaries of the Yakama Nation. The concept plan looks at
 the ability to create pathways and bikeways with the goal of improving
 accessibility and linking to communities outside the Nation, including

Union Gap (Greenway), and also to Zillah, Granger, and Mabton through a variety of potential trails

• The <u>2021-2022 Work Plan</u> outlines efforts over the next 12 months.

WSDOT STATE & REGIONAL UPDATE

Troy Suing, WSDOT South Central Region

Mr. Suing provided an update on current happenings in the South Central Region –

- Watching the federal infrastructure package
- DOT is working through the vaccination mandate passed down by the governor. Affects employees and any contractor, vendor, etc., who comes onto the site. October 18th is deadline to be fully vaccinated and including 2-week waiting period.
- Working on bridge decks (patching) all over Yakima County. Will be replacing the bridge decks over Gordon Road in a couple of years (double bridges west of Yakima)

WASHINGTON TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION UPDATE

James Restucci, WTC Member and YVCOG Chairman

- Commission will be meeting remotely until 2022.
- The Commission will be visiting Yakima Valley in April or June of 2022
- Chairman Restucci asked Mr. Adolf to elaborate on the MSA decision every MPO that is formed thins out the available funds for the existing MPOs. The idea of doing this comes mainly from the metropolises, who want fewer MPOs in order to hold on to more money. Yakima could have lost its MPO status if they changed the threshold from 50,000 to 100,000. Depending on growth rates and census results, we could see another MPO in Yakima County, consisting of Prosser, Sunnyside, Grandview, Mabton, and Granger.
