Senator Honeyford was unable to attend the meeting, but a plaque recognizing his service will be presented to him at a later date. Several of his peers, along with Yakima County citizens, paid him high compliments and expressed their appreciation of him as a person and for all that he has accomplished in the state of Washington and Yakima Valley.

Approval of Minutes – May 18, 2022 General Membership Meeting Bill Moore moved to approve the Minutes from May 18, 2022. Patricia Byers seconded. The motion carried unanimously.

STAFF REPORTS

**Byron Gumz (Planning Manager)** – provided a high-level update on YVCOG land-use planning activities.

- Housing Action Plan presentations have been given in Union Gap and Zillah;
- Various meetings, including Central Washington Home Builders Assocation and a Realtors meeting;
- Processing various land-use permits, subdivisions, annexations, rezones, etc.

## Alan Adolf (Transportation Program Manager)-

- Traffic counts are wrapping up.
- Working on HSTP and transit study.
- Moving forward with Naches/Hwy 12 pedestrian/bicycle safety enhancements:

## Vicki Baker (Regional Program Manager) –

- Recent Kresge meeting discussed how we can stretch our budget by combining projects with other funding sources (CDBG Low Income Senior Citizen Emergency Home Repairs, Housing Action plans, etc.)
- Housing Action Plans recently held a regional CWHBA forum and putting together a realtor forum; lots of community outreach going on.
- Law Enforcement community engagement events will continue through the Central Washington State Fair; we have received over 800 survey responses (100 in Spanish); National Night Out events are completed, etc.
- Regional Crime Intelligence Center working on scope of work and contract with Yakima County. The general outline puts Sheriff in the position to manage the ARPA grant on behalf of Yakima County. We will begin hiring, procurement, and training once we receive the ARPA funds.

**PROGRAM** 

A legislative update was provided Senator Curtis King and Representative Gina Mosbrucker; Richard Evans for US Senator Maria Cantwell, Raquel Ferrel-Crowley for US Senator Patty Murray, and Vicki Holleman-Perez from the Office of Congressman Dan Newhouse (4<sup>th</sup> Congressional District)

Numerous topics were discussed such as the 2023 Appropriations bill, including a \$23 million increase to Yakima River Basin Water Enhancement Project funding over last year; support of Congressionally Directed Spending Requests Yakima's East West Corridor Project and a request for Save the Children Lower

Yakima Valley reducing food insecurity and increasing child literacy; the Inflation Reduction Act; the CHIPS and Science Act; Washington CARES long-term care payroll tax; Paid Family Medical Leave Program, which is now presenting solvency concerns; the \$16 billion transportation plan passed this past legislative session which will fund \$75 million for the Hood River Bridge, as well as local projects on I-82 and the East-West Corridor; worker's compensation rate increases; removal of the Snake River dams and the possibility of replacing that clean energy source with new small nuclear reactors; protecting markets for our farmers; lowering health care costs; along with many other important topics.

UPCOMING GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

The October YVCOG General Membership meeting will be held in person and hosted by the City of Sunnyside. The location is yet to be determined.

The December meeting will be held on December 14, 2022 and hosted by YVCOG.
