- 2023 Outstanding Service Award: Cannot be YVCOG staff. Service should be to the region. Sheriff Udell, Police Chief Cobb, most Police Chiefs, regional Crime Lab nominated. Spent many hours worked to ensure lab works regionally. Operations Board consensus for 2023 Outstanding Service Award.
- National Association of Regional Councils: NARC Executive Directors Conference in Boise. What COGS are doing in their region. Different services and programs. Encourage an Executive Committee member to attend next year.
- Natalie Martinkus ArcGIS / ESRI: GIS expert for YCDA mapping. PSA for YVCOG GIS needs
- **eTrepid:** migration to cloud for our servers. Sole Source request for eTrepid to manage our IT services. Passed all security requirements for Crime Lab.
- **Vision Software Cloud:** migrating software and data from Yakima County. Payable and payroll. Will post our financial to the County for payroll needs.

    City of Yakima which has their own program.
  - Kresge: completed one project. Another underway, 3 applications submitted. Doors and window replacements to improve health and safety.
  - Homeownership downpayment assistance award: final word in December.

#### Vicki for Kathy Geil, Crime Lab Manager

- Completed all but one site visit with Granger.
- Statistics: YTD 68 firearms requests, 10 latent print preservation requests, 10 DNA swabbing requests, 224 cartridge cases request, 4 cell phones, 11 intel projects, 106 NIBIN entries for 69 leads for 65% rate of connection to another agency.
- Working with Chiefs on comprehensive collection of evidence. See all evidence collected.
- Average NIBIN turn around is 8 days. Down from an initial 13 days. Staff is still in training, so requires review. Latent print, test firing, NIBIN correlation training.
- ATF staff in training to start in mid-December.
- Governor Inslee, Chief Batiste, 9 legislators, WSPCS have all toured. Expect legislative support this upcoming session.
- Operations Board approved purchase of the RapidHIT DNA machine and software, as well as LIM Lab Information Management system.
- Quarterly training for agencies next month. First is Evidence Packaging. then coding/NIBRS for better data tracking
